TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2023  
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 16A**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that **Northumberland County Council** (*"the Council"*), in exercise of its powers as the local traffic authority under section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (*"the Act"*) and all other enabling powers, has on the 19<sup>th</sup> May 2023 made the **Northumberland County Council (Kielder Forest Stages Rally 2023) Temporary Traffic Regulation Order 2023** (*"the TTRO"*).

The Council has made the TTRO for the purposes of facilitating the holding of **Kielder Forest Stages Rally 2023** (*"the Event"*) by restricting traffic on **Parish of Greystead Public Bridleway No 3 from a point marked A, 250 metres south of Smalesmouth Farm in a general south-easterly direction for a distance of 3,970 metres to a point marked B, 435 metres east of the Bower and Parish of Greystead Public Bridleway No 8 from a point marked C, 520 metres east of Wainbog Hill in a general southerly direction for a distance of 2,100 metres to a point marked D, 750 metres west of the Bower** (*"the Road"*).

The TTRO shall come into force at **8:00 hours on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2023** and will remain in force until **19:00 hours on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2023**, subject to the provisions of section 16B of the Act.

There will be no alternative route available for the duration of the TTRO

All restrictions on the Road will be sign-posted and staffed and will remain in force only for as long as is necessary.

Nothing in the TTRO shall apply to:

- a. Any activities taking place on the Road related to the organisation and holding of the Event;
- b. Anything done with the permission of, or at the direction of, a police officer or a Duly Authorised Officer of the Council.
- c. Any vehicle being used by, or for the purposes of, the emergency services;
- d. Any vehicle being used by or for the purposes of a statutory undertaker (e.g. the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which requires vehicles to be brought onto the Road); or
- e. Pedestrian access to any premises adjoining the Road.
